# COAST GUARD REQUIREMENTS FOR STANDARD 32-FT BRISTOL BAY GILLNETTER

## ALL VESSELS INSIDE THE BOUNDARY LINE

<b>Immersion suit</b>	One for each person on board – Name of vessel or owner of the suit clearly marked, approved personal marker light, and retro tape
<b>Ring Life Buoy</b>	24" orange with 60' line, vessel name and retro tape
<b>Survival Craft*</b>	Not required if 3 or less persons on board. More than 3 persons on board, require buoyant apparatus
<b>Visual Distress Signals</b>	Inside 3 miles: 3 handheld or 3 parachute flares 3-50 miles: 3 parachute, 6 handhelds, 3 smoke
<b>Fire Extinguishers</b>	Two B-I's or one B-II
<b>406 MHZ EPIRB**</b>	Required beyond 3 NM, must be registered, CAT I or II
<b>Navigation Lights</b>	Side lights, mast light and stern or all around white light, all around red light
<b>Day-Shapes</b>	Two black cones, apex to apex
<b>Sound Producing Device</b>	Means of making an efficient sound signal
<b>Marine Sanitation Device</b>	Required if the vessel has an installed toilet
<b>Placards</b>	Injury placard; Oil Pollution placard; MARPOL (Garbage) placard.

## UNDOCUMENTED OUTSIDE THE BOUNDARY LINE

<b>Survival Craft*</b>	Inflatable buoyant apparatus outside 12 miles of shore
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## DOCUMENTED OUTSIDE THE BOUNDARY LINE (See Egegik Exception)

All the requirements for "Inside the Boundary Line" plus the following:

<b>Survival Craft*</b>	Not required if 3 or less persons on board within 12 miles of shore More than 3 persons on board, require buoyant apparatus within 12 miles of shore Inflatable buoyant apparatus outside 12 miles of shore
<b>First Aid/ CPR</b>	One person trained in both acceptable, first aid kit and manual, not required to be currently certified but recommended, with 3 or more on board
<b>Guards</b>	For exposed hazards
<b>Navigational Publications</b>	Charts of the operating area, U.S. Coast Pilot, Coast Guard Light list, Tide Tables and Tidal Current Tables (small DOT books okay) <b>NOTE: (Excerpts of applicable sections acceptable)</b>
<b>Anchor</b>	Appropriate for vessel and waters, with chain, cable, or rope
<b>Compass/Deviation Table</b>	Table located at the operating station, 8 points checked and recorded on a deviation table
<b>General Alarm System***</b>	Audible alarm system with contact maker at operating station, Red flashing light in any space where noise makes alarm system difficult to hear
<b>Comms Equip/ FCC license</b>	VHF radio required, FCC license on board, not expired, name and number of vessel
<b>Bilge Pump</b>	Operational
<b>Emergency Instructions</b>	Posted or readily available if less than 4 persons on board, cover all required drills
<b>Drills</b>	Monthly, as if there is an actual emergency
<b>Trained drill conductor</b>	Drills conducted by a trained drill conductor, provide proof of training for Drill Conductor

### \*EXEMPTION LETTER FROM SURVIVAL CRAFT REQUIREMENTS:

Vessels with less than 5 people on board inside 12 miles. Letter must be on board to use exemption

\*\*EXEMPTION LETTER FROM EPIRB REQUIREMENTS allows a Personal Locator Beacon to be substituted for an EPIRB under terms described in the Exemption Letter. Neither is required within 3 miles of coast.) Letter must be on board to use exemption.

\*\*\*Each vessel with an accommodation/work space which is not adjacent to the operating station, the alarm is suitable for notifying individuals on board in the event of an emergency, a public address system or other means of alerting all individuals on board may be used in lieu of a general alarm system, testing when getting underway and then weekly.
